We also note there are enlightening definitions of "Boodler" and "Scabbler" in clause 30 of the Australian Workers' Union Construction and Maintenance (Western Australia) Award 2003 AP825520.

Further, the draft award filed by the CFMEU during award modernisation replicated the wording in clause 21.7 of the ACT Award identified above - see here at clause 24.8.3: http://www.airc.gov.au/awardmod/databases/building/Draft/CFMEU correspondence 190109 buil ding.pdf

We can also confirm we will further consider alternatives to the current reference to an Australian Standard in relation to work in compressed air in clause 33.1 (d) of the *Building and Construction General On-site Award 2010*.
