## **Short Note**

- 1. On 16 August, the Full Bench queried whether "child carers" as referred to in paragraph 20 of the Agreed Statement of Facts (**ASOF**) included teachers.
- 2. Paragraph 20 of the ASOF provides the median weekly full-time earnings for "child carers" based on Australian Bureau of Statistics (**ABS**) Employee Earnings (**EEH**).
- 3. The Australian Education Union (**AEU**) seeks to clarify that the ABS data included in paragraph 20 does not include teachers.
- 4. The EEH for Primary School Teachers is \$1984.00 (Annexure A).
- 5. The EEH for Early Childhood (Pre-Primary School) Teachers is \$1666.00 (Annexure B).


