I refer to the above matter.

I am concerned that, in the decision of 19 April 2021 in this matter, there may be a typographical error or inconsistency in one references to a section of the FW Act:

- 1. At paragraph [661], the last bullet point refers to and considers FW Act s 134(1)(g); s 134(1)(f) is not considered.
- 2. Paragraph [662] refers to the FWC not being in a position to make findings in respect of, relevantly, s 134(1)(f).
- 3. Paragraph [665] then refers to affording parties the opportunity to make submissions addressing, relevantly, s 134(1)(g).
- 4. Is it the case that the paragraph [665] reference to s 134(1)(g) should rather be a reference to s 134(1)(f)?

Paragraph [665] will be relevant to the upcoming conciliation and submissions processes; any clarification on this point may assist the parties in those processes.
