# C2013/5139 Application by United Voice and Australian Education Union for Equal Remuneration Order

- 1. We refer to your email sent at 4:35pm on 14 October 2016, which attaches your client's proposed orders to be considered by the Fair Work Commission (the Commission) at the directions hearing on Wednesday. We thought it prudent to give your client some understanding of the Commonwealth's position in advance of the directions hearing. The Commonwealth has carefully considered your client's (and that of the Australian Education Union (AEU)) proposed Third Further Amended Application and your client's proposed approach as indicated in the draft orders.
- While the Commonwealth will consent to the Commission giving both Applicants (noting the proposed order only deals with the application of United Voice) leave to file the amended application in the form filed with the Commission on 28 September 2016, the Commonwealth has some concerns with the balance of the orders proposed. We would note that we do not know the position of the AEU with respect to the proposed orders and approach.
- With respect to the remainder of the proposed orders, our concern is that United Voice are seeking to depart from the ordinary process by which matters of this kind are run. Ordinarily, the applicants would prepare and file all their evidence and the responding parties do the same before the Commission is required to consider complex factual and legal questions including appropriate comparators. To depart from this course should only be done where there are sound reasons in terms of efficiency, time and cost. We do not think those reasons apply here.
- 4. Firstly, the imprecision of your client's further amended Application is such that it will not assist the Commission and the other parties in understanding your client's case or determining this complex question early. The Application is vague and imprecise as to the very question of appropriate comparators. It does not specify the respective appropriate comparators for all the classifications in each of the

- instruments identified in paragraph 2 of the Application, noting the breadth of the unspecified instruments in sub-paragraph 2.d of the amended Application.
- 5. Secondly, the Commonwealth does not believe that it is possible to determine the very important question of appropriate comparators in a vacuum (where not all of the respective classifications are considered) and without the benefit of evidence upon which a proper assessment of work value can be undertaken. For the Commission to be required to do otherwise is likely to lead to the Commission either not being able to determine the question or determining it at such a level of hypothetical generality that any decision will not actually assist in any final determination of the matter.
- 6. Accordingly, it is the position of the Commonwealth that the better approach would be for the matter to proceed in an orthodox fashion where the applicants put on all the evidence upon which they intend to rely. It may be that once the evidence has been filed by all parties that the Commission is able to determine discrete questions but the appropriateness (including efficiency) of such an approach cannot be determined until after this point.
