STATUTORY DECLARATION

Statutory Declarations Act 1959

I, Chantelle Zentveld

make the following declaration under the Statutory Declarations Act 1959:

- 1. After many years of being unable to speak up for myself, this is an opportunity to not only speak up for myself, but also for those who are oblivious to what has been happening surrounding the outdated Zombie Agreement the Subway stores involved operate under.
- 2. When I started working at Subway in November of 2021, I and other employees were advised that staff were paid above the Fast-Food Award, I was so excited to be working in what seemed to be a supportive and ethical environment with lovely crew members.
- 3. This statement about paying above the Award proved to be incorrect, which I only discovered after I had worked 18 hours at Subway in December, and 10 hours at another Fast-Food chain, and received more pay for 10 hours than I did for the 18 hours of work in the exact same week.
- 4. I felt taken advantage of and felt that my time and efforts were not appreciated.
- 5. I was not a confident person prior to working at Subway, but the confrontational set-up displayed in stores certainly helped, and my personal efforts to step out of my comfort zone was something my manager did appreciate.
- 6. The Zombie Agreement and its outdated conditions seemed to penalise me, leaving me feeling unappreciated.
- 7. Conditions everywhere have drastically changed since 2011 when this Enterprise Agreement was put in force, operating under such expired conditions felt like robbery.
- 8. The discrepancies (such as no penalty rates and 20% casual loading compared to 25%) between the current Fast-Food Award and the Zombie Agreement I worked under add up to be huge amounts for a teenager trying to save money or even those who pay rent and fuel.
- 9. I couldn't imagine the money those who have worked there for a long period had been denied due to this. I felt sick.

- The termination of this Agreement would have a significant positive impact on me 10. as it would on all employees who should be properly valued and appreciated for their time and effort the job requires.
- 11. Employees are not 'better off overall', they are worse off overall.

I understand that a person who intentionally makes a false statement in a statutory declaration is guilty of an offence under section 11 of the Statutory Declarations Act 1959, and I believe that the statements in this declaration are true in every particular.
